The benches match the structure perfectly, and make the structure more user friendly for the classes working outside in it. Clerical Hours Set To Change at the School

Our minor enrollment decline this year is going to have a major impact on the Secretarial time we are going to have for the remainder of the school year. The Support Staff contract ties student enrolment to the clerical hours available for all school secretaries. This year our enrollment dropped just below 200 students, and this is resulting in a reduction of weekly hours for Mrs. Weston, our school secretary. Beginning on November 17th, there will be no secretary in the office after 1:00 pm.

While we will do our best to answer phones in the afternoon whenever possible, and to check messages before the end of the school day, we ask that you make every effort to make bus arrangements with your child(ren) earlier in the day so late day switches can be avoided. We understand that emergent issues may arise and we will do our best to limit the inconvenience this change may create.
