Current research shows that students who miss just 10% of the school year (that equates to about 18 days in the school year) are at risk for not only falling behind in the current academic year but also withdrawing from social connections at school. We also know that getting our kids to school can be difficult some mornings so please let our staff know how we can support you.

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### Communication

Teachers all use a planner or back and forth book to allow for consistent communication about day-to-day happenings. Please use these to let the school know about things like pick up plans or to request a meeting time with teachers. If there is a last-minute change in plans for your child, please call the school to let us know. Regular communication will also come from the school through newsletters that will be emailed home and posted on our school website.

We are dedicated to providing time and space for respectful conversation about student learning and growth. We ask that parents/caregivers to set up times to discuss important matters so that we can achieve this. Bell times are not good for discussions as teachers are busy with students the second the bell rings. We will approach each situation professionally and respectfully and ask that parents/caregivers demonstrate respect as well.

We are all committed to being open to feedback and are willing to learn and grow alongside the students. If the issue goes unresolved then please contact me directly. ### **Learning Updates**

Learning Updates happen 5 times a year for elementary students: 2 informal reports, which usually occur in the form of learning conferences at the school, and 3 formal written learning updates. Teachers will also be in regular communication with parents and caregivers if there are academic or behaviour concerns. As always, you are always welcome to ask teachers for updates throughout the year as well.

We continue to use the same reporting scale when reporting on student progress:

# **Personal Belongings**

We ask that parents and caregivers please help us in keeping student personal belongings at school. Toys, cards, games, and special trinkets should not be coming to school. Our classrooms are busy, and these often distract students from learning, and lead to disagreements amongst students. We are also not responsible for lost, broken, or misplaced items, which is inevitable in a large group setting. Students who bring personal belongings to school will be asked to keep them in their backpacks. If this becomes an issue, the teacher will ask students to leave their items on the teacher's desk to be claimed at the end of the day.

### **Bikes and Scooters**

We encourage students and families to travel to and from school in Earth Friendly ways. Our neighbourhood provides a safe and easy way to walk, scoot and ride around, and we would love to see more students taking

advantage of this. We have bike racks available in our school courtyard for students to lock up bikes and scooters. If you need help with a lock, please let us know; we have extras available. During recess and lunch, we ask students to keep their bikes and scooters locked up, they are not to be used at recess and lunch.

# **Meals Programming**

Eating nutritious food throughout the day is an important part of learning – food fuels our brains, and we are dedicated to supporting that at Marie Sharpe. We are fortunate to run a great breakfast program for students arriving at school without having had breakfast at home, or for those who have had an early start and long bus ride. Through generous funding and volunteer support, we also provide nutritious snacks and lunches for families who need them.

# **Bus Conduct**
