Mrs. Ikebuchi's Class April Learning Intentions

Math:

Kindergarten students continue to review math concepts and skills learned this year (sorting, patterning, counting, numbers, money, concepts more/less, measurement) and will be learning addition.

Grade 2 students are reviewing addition and subtraction to 100 and learning linear measurement.

Grade 3-4 students are learning division and how to calculate the perimeter of shapes.

Language Arts:

Kindergarten students continue to learn alphabet letters and corresponding sounds, and printing concepts.

Grade 2-4 students continue to build their reading and writing fluency. We will be working on fictional writing and responding to fiction/non-fiction text.

Social Studies

Grade K-4 continue to explore the Big Idea that people from diverse cultures and societies share some common experiences and aspects of life.

Science

Grade K-4 will be learning about conservation and ways to reduce, reuse, and recycle during April. Grade 2-4 are also reviewing thermal energy.

Physical and Health Education

Grade K-4 are learning to play floor hockey and continue to explore healthy ways to deal with big feelings.

Fine Arts

Students will be learning how to dance a variety of powwow steps. In music, students are preparing for the year end showcase.

March:

Science-Climate Change/ Sustainable Living and associated STEM activities. (I posted some designs on PAC site)

Math-Integers and the Cartesian Plane Graphing

Socials-Discrimination, Poverty and Slavery

Language Arts- Reading for Comprehension/ Exploring different Genre of books and writing Pen Pal letters to a school in Switzerland.

Health- Anti Smoking, Anti Vaping and Avoiding Substance Abuse- Students made posters and discussed what actions they could do if they had a friend who was abusing substances.

PE- Finishing Volleyball, XC skiing, skating at Tsi Del Del

April:

Math-Fractions, Decimals, Percentage and Probability

Language Arts- Novel Study - exploring the theme of "Resilience", Reading for Information, and making connections to characters in the novel.

Science-Exploring the big idea that elements consist of one type of atom, and compounds consist of atoms of different elements chemically combined.

Socials- Canada and the Global Economy- Trade, Global Response to Emergencies, Organizations for Change, International Governmental Organizations

PE- Preparation for Track and Field Events and for health students are exploring Adolescence and Puberty.
