ATTENTION GRADE II PARENTS

In order for students to graduate in BC, they must complete Career Life Connections I2 (CLC I2). CLC I2 is comprised of Work Experience, Assignments and a Capstone project. Presently gr. I2 students complete this course in their gr. I2 year, which can be very stressful. As such, we are restructuring how the course is being offered. Gr. II students can now start the course in grade II (most of the assignments and Work experience). Gr. II students will be able to start their Capstone projects in May of their gr. II year and continue into gr. I2 if need be. Anyone who does not complete the Assignments and Work Experience by the end of gr. II will still be able to complete these in gr. I2. This contest is open to ALL students from public schools, private schools, and Band operated schools <u>regardless of their ethnicity</u>; you do not need to be First Nations, Inuit, or Métis!!

The poetry <u>must</u> be about the culture of First Nations, Inuit, or Métis. This will be a great opportunity for all students to learn about and research the First Nations, Inuit, or Métis culture.

Entry deadline is Wednesday, January 31, 2024 at 4:30 p.m.

Judging will take place by a committee in February/March 2024. The winners will be announced shortly thereafter.

Poems must be titled, typed, or neatly written, single or double line spacing.

All entries must be the original work of the student entering the contest.

Students may submit multiple entries. Please only one poem per page!
