
Youth TRAIN in Trades (YTT)

Who Can Apply

- Students in grade 10 or 11
- Students with an interest in welding as a career choice
- Students with excellent work ethic and school attendance

Academic Prerequisites


- Maintaining a C+ average in core courses
- Minimum C+ average in Math 10/11 (Foundations Math preferred), English 10/11/12
- In graduation standing

How to Apply

- Schedule an application appointment with the Career Centre
- Interview with Coordinator of Career Programs of SD 27
- Complete the application package including an Education Plan, resume and letter of reference from a community member and return to the Career Centre within one month of interview
- Student academic and attendance progress will be monitored as part of the selection process
- Accuplacer Test will be scheduled in the semester prior to program intake

Student Acceptance

 Students accepted into the program will be notified within 4 months of the program intake date



Welder Level C

is a person who has training in and is capable of welding ferrous and non-ferrous metals in all positions, on both plate and/or pipe, using various welding processes. Certified welders qualify for testing with CSA, BCSA and for ASME procedures in British Columbia.

Certified welders will qualify to test for Pressure Welding Procedure tests in British Columbia (PWP), BCP-100. Pressure procedure tests are administered by the BC Safety Authority.

Credential issued

ITA Certificate of Qualification Welder—Level C

How do I apply?

Applications for this 28 week program are being accepted from School District No. 2 7 students on a first come basis. Selected students enter the program in February of their grade 11 or 12 year.
