The Book Fair

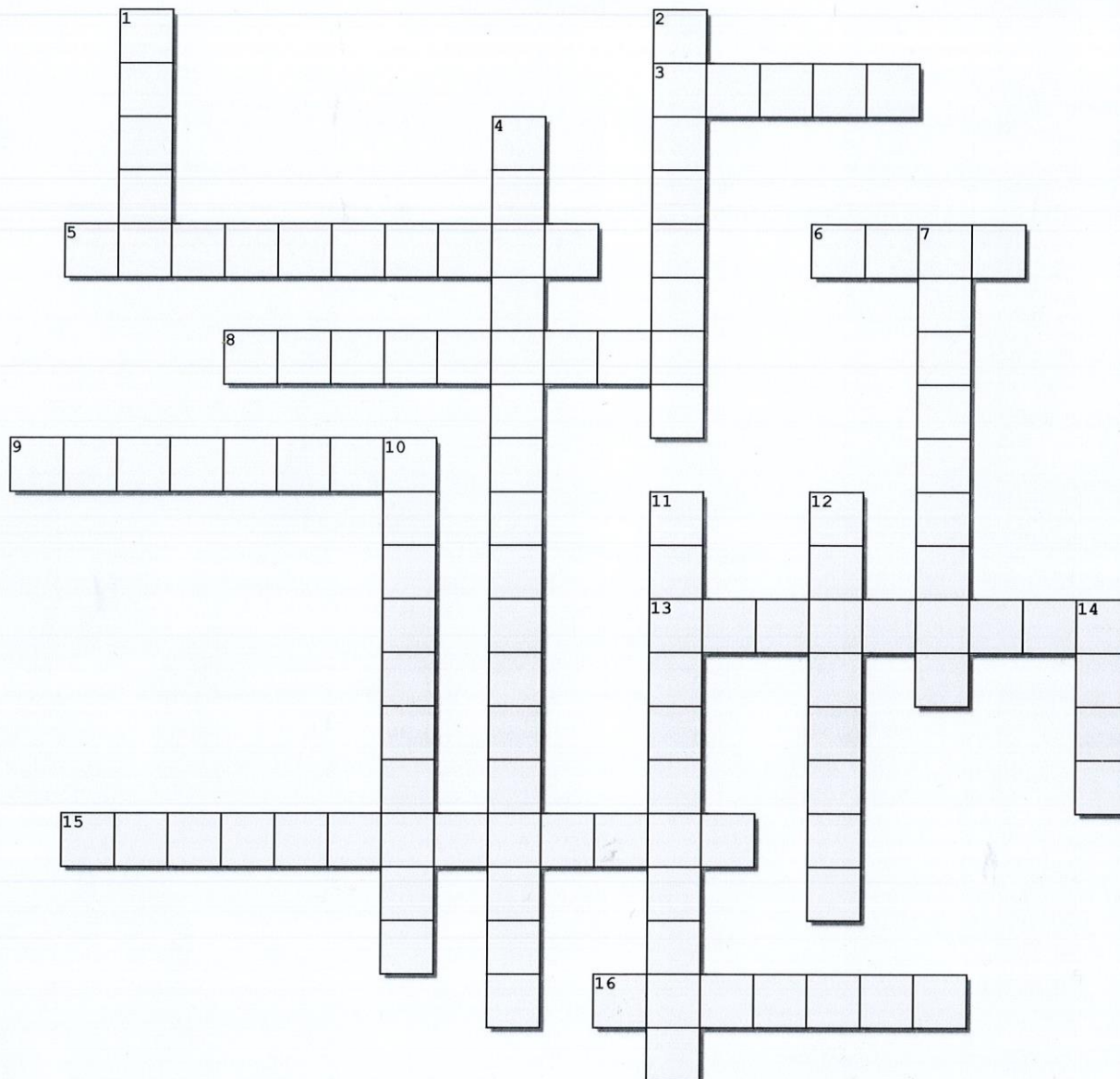
