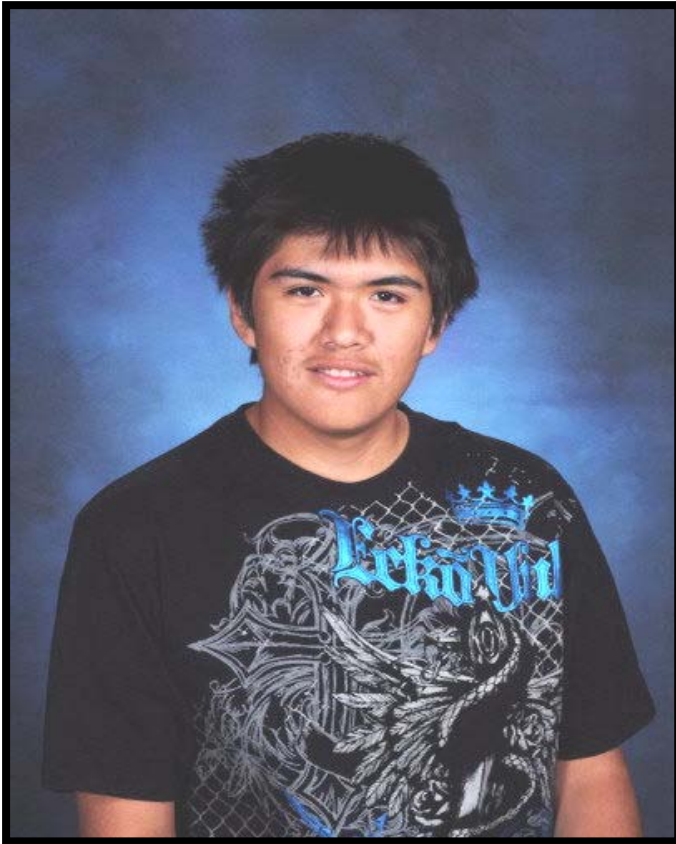


WACEY ALPHONSE
