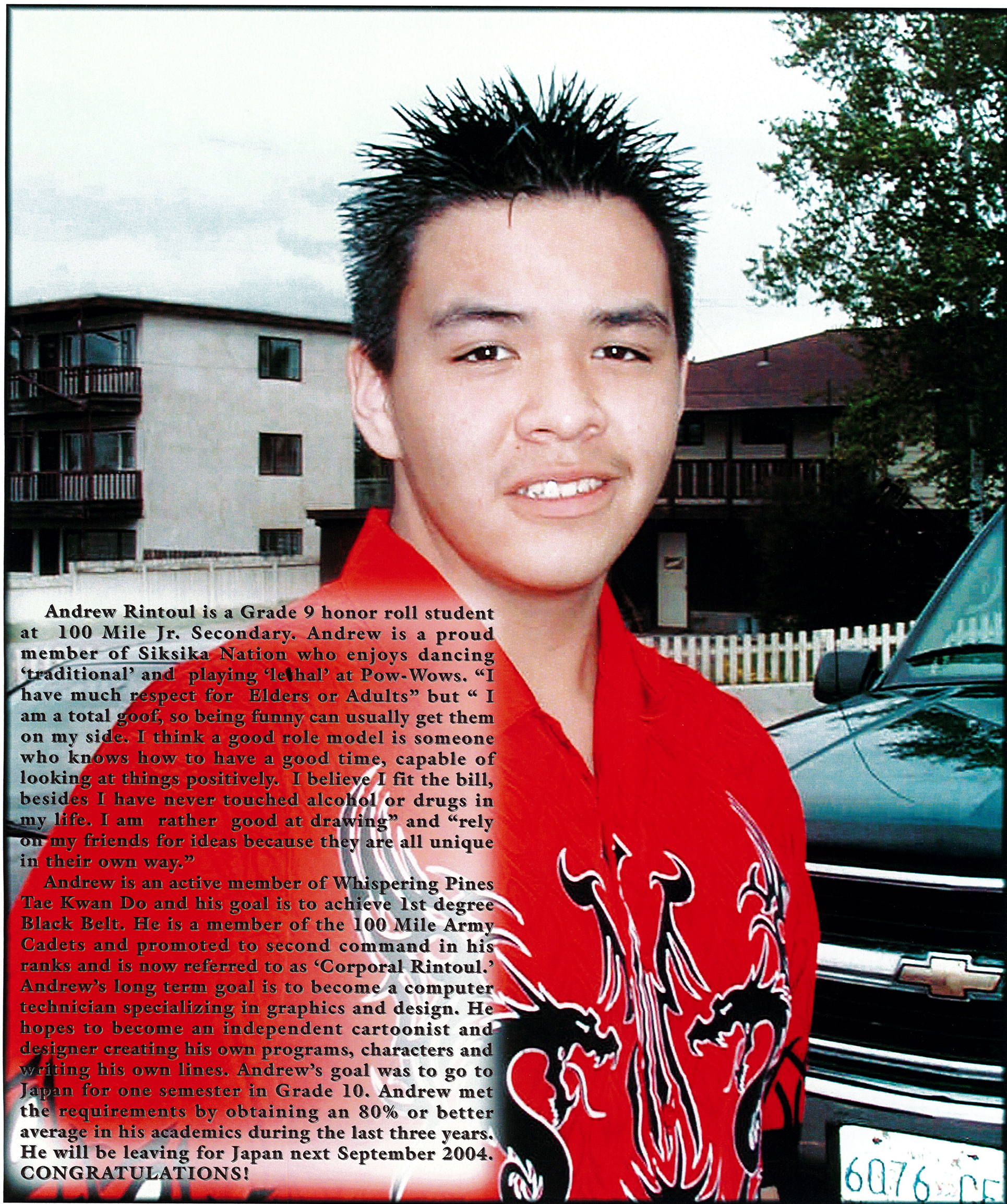


Andrew Rintoul

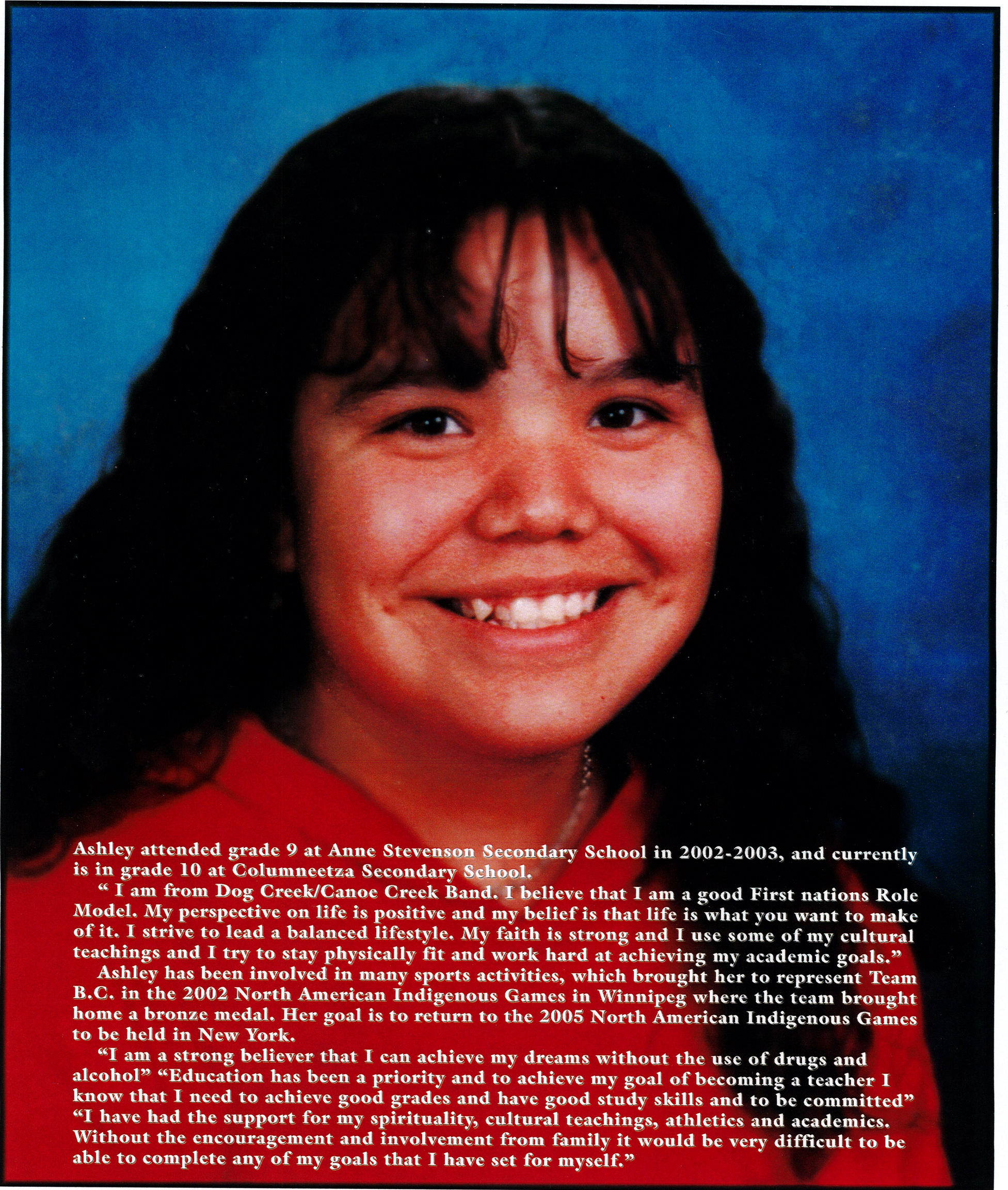
