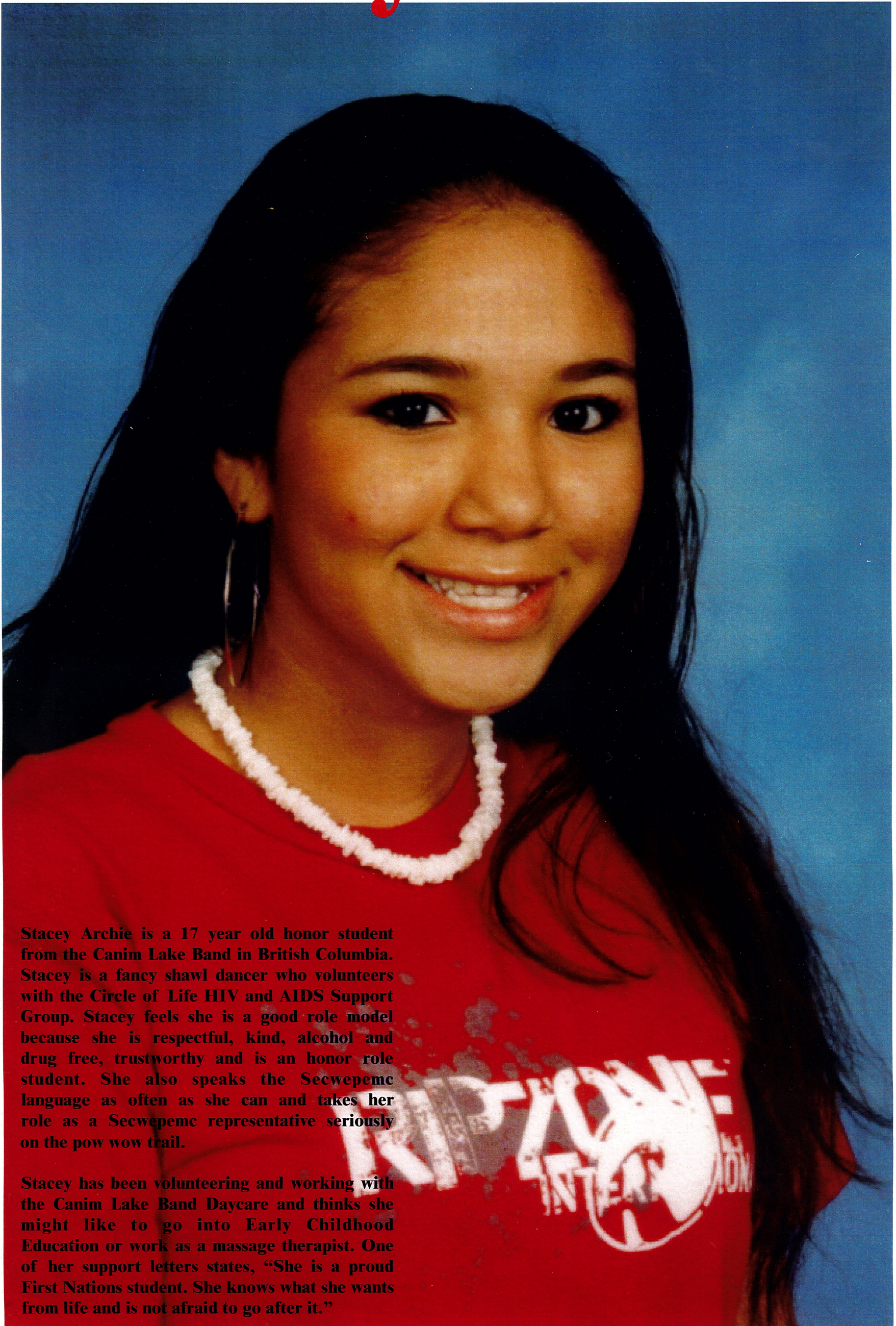


Stacey Archie

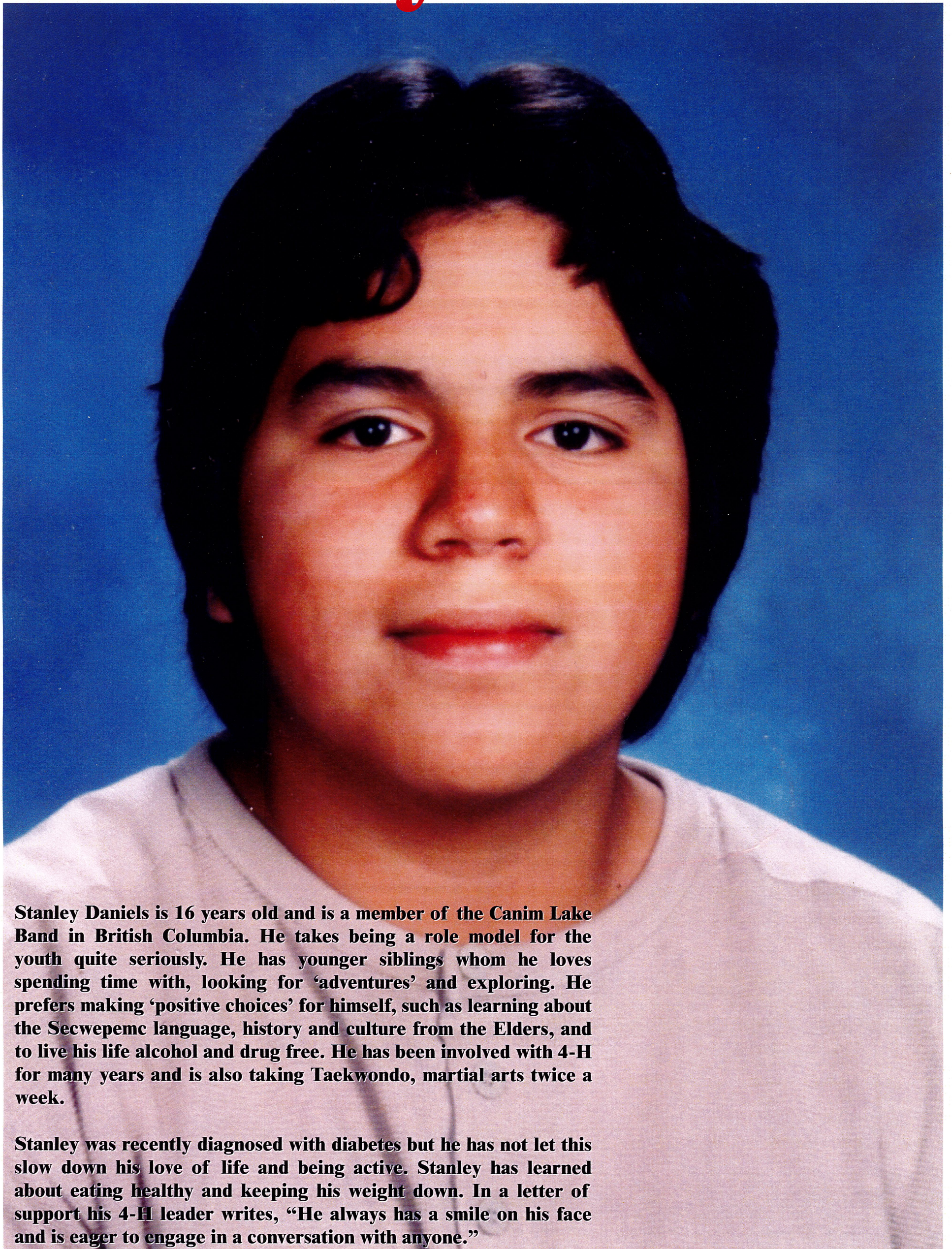
