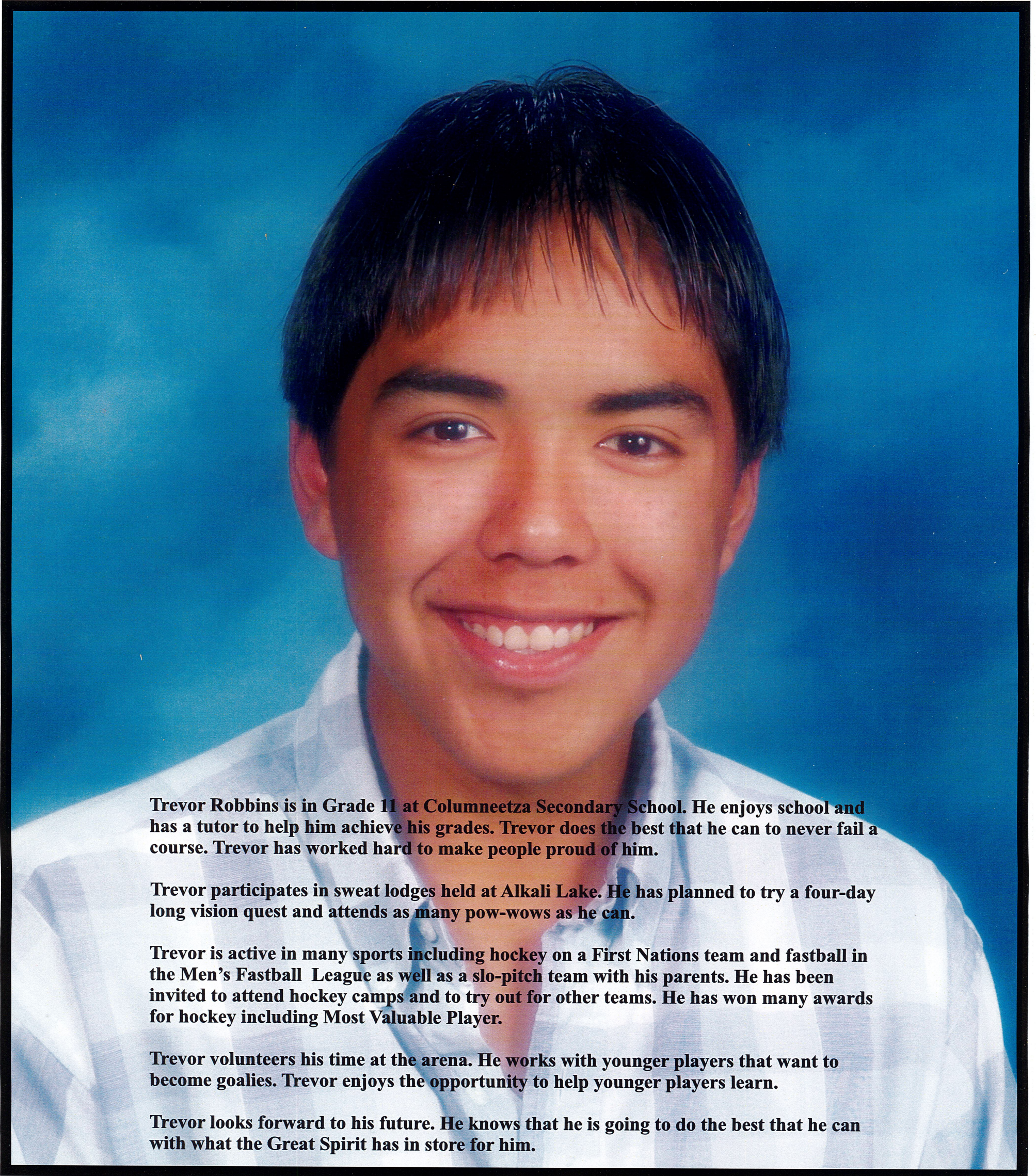


Trevor Robbins

Trevor volunteers his time at the arena. He works with younger players that want to become goalies. Trevor enjoys the opportunity to help younger players learn.

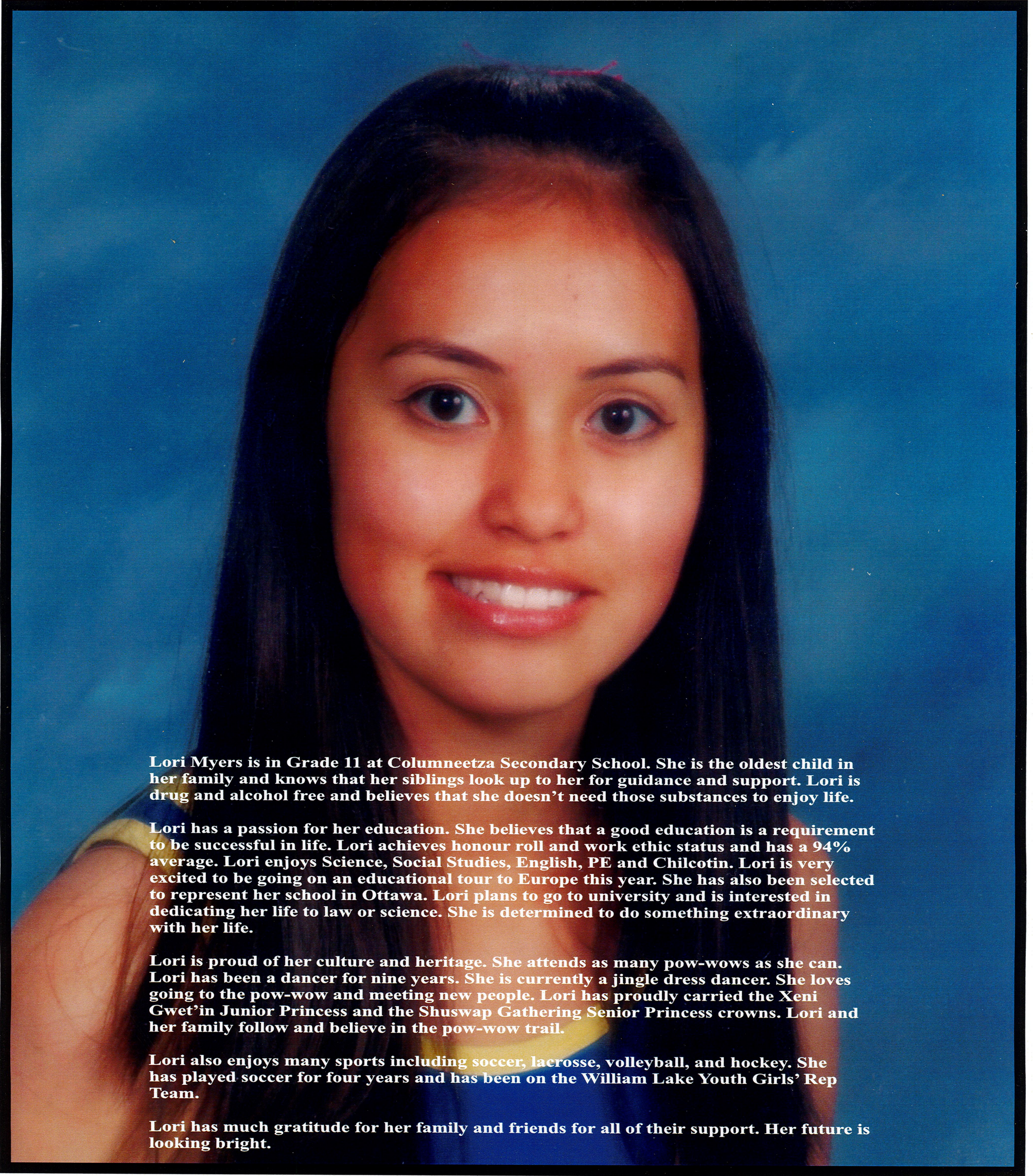
Trevor looks forward to his future. He knows that he is going to do the best that he can with what the Great Spirit has in store for him.
