#### C. <u>REPORTS</u>:

# i) Superintendents Report: Chris Van der Mark, Superintendent

• Transitions to the high schools are important. They are looking at the time table currently to help make the students more successful in their transition. Part of this is tied to the Equity Scan. What is the learning environment? What should it look like?

It is about having proper spaces, having language and culture. Are we doing that now?

We are talking about belonging and we have a lot of work to do, no question. On the plus side it is a priority of the Board of Education etc.

- Community Visits: Jerome Beauchamp and I were at Nemiah a few weeks ago. Very interesting conversations on how to expand language and culture in their community.
- Looking forward to more Local Education Agreements being completed in the future.
- Looking at how to make schools more functional: We need to look at things differently. It is simple to make the school more accessible to the First Nations community. The harder bits are always around personal and hiring. Lots of work, but I am optimistic.

# ii) Director of Instruction, Education Services (Elem.) Report: Jerome Beauchamp

- Jerome shared where we are with the staffing. We have a new Shuswap Language Teacher here in the Williams Lake area. They are big in music and drums. We are trying to fill other support and language positions in the District. Struggling with getting Alexis Creek language position filled. Hope to have this done soon.
- We hired a Language Coach on a contract basis to work with our language teachers. He will work with them on language instruction itself.
- Community visit with Chris to Nemiah.
- The Transition positions are in process. This will be a big help in the high schools.

# ii) IUOE Report: Sue Sim, President:

IUOE ratified their Collective Agreement on November 30, 2019 for a 3 year term, effective July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2022. FNCSW and FNYLW will receive a 2% wage increase effective July 1, of each year. The first wage increase was retroactive to July 1, 2019. The retroactive payment was made on December 24, 2019.

FNYLW that are required to transport students (as requested by their principals), will need to purchase Business insurance on their vehicle. FNYLW will now be reimbursed in full for the cost of upgrading their insurance. This refund will be issued upon submission of receipts to the First Nations Education Department.

The School District and the Union have come to an agreement on FNYLW Transition Worker position. There is one posting in the North End and one posting in the South End. The immediate focus will be to work with grade 12 students towards graduation requirements. Eventually the goal is to work with all students, grade 6 to 12, that are transitioning to Williams Lake from their communities.
