BACKGROUND



Once again, School District 27 started the year with a general learning session for all 900 employees. The entire District had the pleasure of learning from Monique Gray Smith and Phillis Webstad as we continue our learning on our path of Truth and Reconciliation. All employees were gifted the books, "I Hope, and "Beyond the Orange Shirt Story."

Feedback from schools has been powerful and positive and we build on our learning from Kevin Lamoureux.

Below are some samples of school reflections:

"Nesika Staff were moved by Monique Gray Smith's powerful messages about hope, light, and "making space in the circle". In reflecting, we connected this sentiment to the important message from Kevin Lamoureux about being "like the Buffalo", encircling and supporting our youth and our colleagues who need our strength. In the afternoon, we were grateful to have our Secwepemctsín language teacher Dannika Murphy take us through land acknowledgement and traditional welcome song outside."

"We had a wonderful conversation about Monique's definition of 'hope' and worked through some plans later in the day with that idea in mind. It transformed into some wonderful plans about k-6 school connection and belongingness. This is significant as some teachers were not getting on board with this for years and suddenly, they are open to it. Learning from Monique and Phyllis really got this moving along for us."
