2023-24 Student Course Selection has begun so Gr. 10 & 11 students have started choosing the courses they would like to take next year. Course handbooks have been emailed out and are available on our school website. If you have questions, please contact the school.

Grade 12 - Career Life Connections (CLC) is a course requirement that must be completed



outside of the timetable. Grade 12 students will receive a letter grade for this course. If Grade 12 students do not complete the 3 component requirements, they will not graduate. The 3 components are: online course work, work experience and a Capstone project.

2023 Graduates! - Please ensure that you check in with Ms. Nowotny and Ms. Palmer at the Career Centre to ensure that all your graduation requirements are being met, as well as your work experience and CLC course work. Provincial Literacy and Numeracy Assessments – Before graduating all students are required to write a **Provincial Numeracy (Grade 10)** and **Literacy Assessments (Grades 10 & 12)**. Confirm with Mr. Brown to ensure that you are scheduled or have completed the assessments.

Indigenous Grad Requirement – Starting next year, all students graduating in BC must complete at least one Indigenous course in Grade 10, 11 or 12 to be eligible to graduate. For more information, please go to:

Student Learning Survey - The Satisfaction Survey is an annual province-wide census of Grades



7, 10 and 12 students, their parents, and staff in public schools. The questions were developed with input from partner groups, teachers and experts in educational measurement and special education. School Messenger - LCSS is using School Messenger automatic callout module. The program is linked to MyEd BC and sends out emails, phone calls and messages to parents whose children did not go to class for that morning or afternoon (unexcused absence).
