Provincial Literacy and Numeracy Assessments – Before graduating all students are required to write a Provincial Numeracy (Grade 10) and Literacy Assessments (Grades 10 & 12). Confirm with Mr. Brown to ensure that you are scheduled or have completed the assessments.

Last chance to write provincial assessments will be the June 26 – 29.

School Messenger - LCSS is using School Messenger automatic callout module. The program is linked to MyEd BC and sends out emails, phone calls and messages to parents whose children did not go to class for that morning or afternoon (unexcused absence).
