Grade 12 - Career Life Connections (CLC) is a course requirement that must be completed outside of the timetable. Grade 12 students will receive a letter grade for this course. If Grade 12 students do not complete the 3 component requirements, they will not graduate. The 3 components are: online course work, work experience and a Capstone project.

Provincial Literacy and Numeracy Assessments – Before graduating all students are required to write a Provincial Numeracy (Grade 10) and Literacy Assessments (Grades 10 & 12). Confirm with Mr. Brown to ensure that you are scheduled or have completed the assessments. Last chance to write provincial assessments will be June 19-23.

School Messenger - LCSS is using School Messenger automatic callout module. The program is linked to MyEd BC and sends out emails, phone calls and messages to parents whose children did not go to class for that morning or afternoon (unexcused absence).
