1st Day of School Wednesday, September 4th (½ day) 8:45am-11:30am

I'd like to welcome all students back to school this year, with a special welcome to our new students and staff! The first day of school is a ½ day. New students/registrations, please report to the office.

First Day (Sept 4th) Procedures:

Grade 7's – All Grade 7 students will go to the gym and take a seat in the bleachers and administration will conduct a 'Welcome Back' assembly. After the assembly, class lists will be called out and Grade 7 teachers will then take their students to their classrooms for the remainder of the day to get organized.

Grade 8's and 9's All Grade 8 and 9 students will need to find their homerooms and then go to their homerooms for the remainder of the morning. Alphabetical homeroom lists will be posted inside the main foyer and in front of the library. Once

students are in their homeroom classrooms, they will be given their schedules and all other necessary information to start the year. Grade 8's and Grade 9's will be called to the gym for grade specific 'Welcome Back' assemblies.

Please update your child's Verification form, sign the Media Consent, Computer/Privacy Consent and Walking Field Trip forms and return to school.

Students will be dismissed at 11:25am. BUSES will arrive at 11:30am to take students home.

District Planning Day (Tuesday, September 3th)

The 2024-25 school year starts with a District Planning Day on Tuesday, September 3, 2024. This planning day is a unique opportunity for our entire organization to continue our engagement and understanding on the effects of trauma, both historic as the legacy of residential schools. The District will be joined Monique Gray Smith, indigenous author and speaker to lead our learning on these topics. All staff will gather at their school or worksites and participate. Students are not at school this day.

Safety Upgrades

Full fire alarm upgrade with a new alarm sound.

In the morning, the front door will open for students and staff. There will be 2 additional exit doors unlocked at 8:05am when supervision begins for students and staff to enter the building near parent drop off locations: the doors into the upper floor of the main school building in between the cafeteria building and the industrial education building (by Room 130), and the back doors by the gym (small bus drop off and by Room 187). After the first bell, all exit doors will be locked and doors to the cafeteria building and the industrial education building will be temporarily opened to welcome students into the space. This is to enforce student and staff safety. The front doors of the school will always remain open during the school day. During breaks and lunch the 3 sets of exit doors will be opened to make school washrooms more accessible and monitored by Noon Hour Supervisors and administration.

Verification Forms & Medical Information

Student verification forms will be sent home in the first week of school. It is very important that we get your child's up-to-date information as soon as possible including contact information so that we can call home if your child needs you.

For parents of students with severe allergies/anaphylaxis, Public Health now recommends that 2 EpiPens are always kept at school. Please check with the office to make sure that we have an EpiPen for your child and that it is up-to-date. If your child wears a Medical Alert bracelet, please make sure the school knows they wear it at school. For students with a seizure

condition or Type 1 Diabetes, please make the school aware so that we can plan for safety and complete safety planning promptly.


Calling in Absences

At Columneetza we feel regular attendance is a crucial component of academic performance. Students are expected to be on time and attend every class. If students are ill or cannot attend for other reasons, it is up to the parent or guardian to notify the School Messenger system at 1 (833) 582-6944, using the phone app, website login or calling the school. https://go.schoolmessenger.com All undocumented absences will be considered unexcused absences. Poor attendance may result in a file review and a meeting with the student and guardian(s).

Noon Hour Supervision

Salmon Trip (Open to Grade 9s)

September 18th-20th. The goal of this trip is to involve young people in activities that help them appreciate how a watershed works—the animals, the plants, the water, the geography, and the role of human interaction. Space is limited and students must complete an application (email: nara.riplinger@sd27.bc.ca for the application).

Some of the activities will include: monitoring salmon health, identifying stream invertebrates, hiking, learning the importance of salmon and healthy watersheds from First Nation leaders, and working with UNBC researchers. The cost is \$50 but see Ms. Riplinger or Mr. Cook if this is prohibitive. Activities on this trip can also be incorporated into a capstone project or Independent Studies credits.

Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA)

Fair Notice for Students and Parents

Cariboo-Chilcotin School District No. 27

Dear Students & Parents/Guardians,

Cariboo-Chilcotin School District is committed to creating and maintaining school environments in which students, staff, parents/guardians/caregivers, and others feel safe. Schools cannot ignore any threat of violence. This notice provides some information for students, parents and guardians about the approach to responding to potential threats.

What is a threat?

A threat is an expression of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something. Threats may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the internet, or made by gesture.

Duty to report:

To keep school communities safe and caring, staff, parents/ guardians/caregivers, students, and community members must report all threat related behaviour to the school principal.

How to Report:

Members of the school community may contact the school office and ask to speak to the principal directly to report or make an online report through the <u>erase</u> link featured on the district and school websites.

What is the purpose of a student threat assessment?

 To ensure and promote the emotional and physical safety of students, staff, parents, the student making the threat, and others.

- To ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat.
- To understand the factors contributing to the person of concern's (threat-maker's) behaviour.
- To be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the person of concern.
- To promote the emotional and physical safety of all.

What behaviours warrant a Student Violence Threat Risk Assessment to be initiated?

A student threat assessment will be initiated for behaviours including, but not limited to:

- Verbal/written threats to harm/ kill others ("clear, direct, and plausible")
- Threats made via social media to harm, kill, or cause serious property damage
- Serious violence or violence with intent to harm and kill
- Indicators of suicidal ideation as it relates to fluidity (homicidal/suicidal)
- Weapon possession (including replicas)
- Bomb threats (or possession/detonation of devices)

- Hate incidents motivated by factors including, but not limited to: race, culture, religion, and/or sexual orientation
- Sexual intimidation, sextortion, extortion or assault
- Domestic, interpersonal, relational violence
- Gang-related intimidation and violence
- Fire setting (contextual)

Collection Notice:

The School District is subject to personal information privacy laws and will undertake the collection of this information in compliance with the requirements of such laws, including by limiting collection to information that is relevant and necessary to address a risk or threat and by ensuring that information is collected from online sources is only collected from open-source sites. The School District will not collect information as part of a threat assessment unless there is reason to believe that a threat exists. Information collected as part of a threat assessment may be provided to law enforcement authorities in appropriate circumstances.
