i) <u>Superintendent's Report: Chris van der Mark</u>

- Chris presented his SD27 Superintendent Highlights for 2021-2022. He acknowledged that there has been a lot of change. We raised expectations. We have Innovation funds; we have a Learning Series and a Leadership Series so we can grow. We to strive to have our students receive Dogwood diplomas. It has been a challenge to make changes. Teachers have had to work harder to achieve these positive outcomes. We are seeing more people showing leadership. It is so important to see these shifts.
- The Kevin Lamoureux Presentation was the most attended of our Pro-d sessions. We will continue with the Phyllis Webstad and Monique Grey Smith presentations for all staff in September.
- Principals now participate in the LEA meetings to provide updates on how their students for that community are doing. There is better communication than in the past.
- Distribution of Technology: We have made major changes here in providing equitable access to technology.
- Foundation Skills Assessment: FSA's are important to monitor student achievement. We now have consistent reading data on students across the district, no matter what school you are in. It will improve learning outcomes.
- Thank you to Lewis Budgell, Cindy Charleyboy and Rosalie Montgomery for help with Admin hirings recently.
- Daycare: The School District received a grant for 3 million dollars to reform the dorms into a 119-seat daycare as well as before and after school care. Timeline could be 2 years; but this is very needed.

Language and Culture:

i) How are we Doing Report? Grant Gustafson

Grant read stats from the How are we Doing Report. He said that we want to close the gaps between indigenous learners on reserve and non-indigenous learners. Success rates trending upwards but are still not where we want them to be.

Grant showed data comparing graduation rates with adult graduates removed, also a statistic of concern.

Chris reminded FNEC that this is a provincial slide that Grant is showing. It is all over the province this concern.

Grant also showed the FSA Data: SD27 Grade 4 Reading was 76% over non-indigenous students at 74%.

ii) Graduation 2022: Grant Gustafson

Grant read the 2022 Indigenous Student Graduation numbers for the high schools:

- Lake City Secondary School (WL Campus): June 11, 2022. They have 60 Indigenous Graduates (58 Dogwood & 2 Evergreen Leaving Certificates).
- Peter Skene Ogden Secondary School: June 17, 2022. 5 Dogwood & 1 Evergreen.
- Grow/Skyline: Grad is June 9th. They have 11 Indigenous Graduates all Dogwood.

We hope to take both the 2021 and new 2022 Role Models in parade this year.
