iv) Indigenous Peoples Day, Poetry Contest: Tracy Hubner

Poems are starting to come into our office now. This contest closes on Friday, March 11, 2022. After Spring Break the poems will be categorized and sorted to be ready for judges.

v) Orientation Video – what to include:

Grant Gustafson would like to do a First Nations piece here to give more knowledge to staff. Examples of content could be footage related to Esk'etemc cross cultural day,

welcome songs in all 3 languages, opening prayer in all 3 languages and messages from different Chiefs, Role Models, what we do in the school district, where to find curriculum resources, strategies for dealing with trauma, important landmarks/dates throughout the year, etc.

Grant asked if anyone wants to be involved in this project, to please let him know. One member said that they would like it to also explain the proposal format and what can be applied for.

We are only brainstorming today. Send us your ideas and we can elaborate on it.

FNEC asked Grant to provide FNEC a timeline of when they must have things done by and if we are looking for a committee to do this, then ensure one person from each nation is on it.
