

- Use research based, literacy skill development, to improve literacy skills.


Strategies and Structures:

- Actions for Enhancing Student Learning and Experience
 - Continue to make literacy important in all subjects.
 - Showcase literacy during school assemblies.
 - Showcase writing examples during daily writing practice.
- Actions for Enhancing Staff Capacity & Learning
 - Provide opportunity for teachers share skills learned at professional development days during staff meetings.
 - Anchor writing assessment with other teachers.
 - Discuss assessment and writing skill development with parents during parent teacher interviews.



Outdoor Education

Outdoor education will be a continued school goal with classes being encouraged to experience learning outside whenever possible.

Indigenous Learning

The school will have a year long plan to investigate and participate in Indigenous activities and culture.

- Provide students with a monthly activity involving indigenous culture.
- Attend Orange Shirt Day events.
- Observe the local salmon return and the connection to indigenous culture.
- Engage in field trips that highlight Indigenous culture and land-based learning.
- Integration of First peoples' principles of learning into the curriculum.

School Team Planning Cycle

- The staff will meet monthly and review school goals.
- Assessment results will be reviewed with the staff after major assessment events including EPRA/DART/School Wide Write and FSA.
- Adjust targets if needed based on assessment results.

EPRA/DART- Performance based literacy assessments developed for BC educators.

FSA-Provincial based literacy and numeracy tests for grade 4 and 7 students.
